How much is lost to pokies in this District?

Approximately \$4.4 million was lost on pokies in pubs, clubs and TABs in Central Otago District during 2022. That is about \$12,140 each day.

Compared to 2021, the amount lost on pokies **increased** by around **\$110,000**.



How many pokie machines and venues are there?

There are 112 Class 4 pokie machines across ten venues in Central Otago District as at 31 December 2022.

That's four fewer than the previous year.



Where are the pokie venues located in the District?

Around 60% of all Class 4 pokie venues in Aotearoa are in medium-high or very-high areas of deprivation.

In Central Otago District, **no** venues are in the most deprived communities.



Gambling harm in Aotearoa

An estimated 30-60% of all Class 4 pokie losses come from the 1.6% of New Zealanders who are moderate to severe risk gamblers.*

It is clear that a significant portion of pokie losses come from a small number of adults who are experiencing gambling harm.



Who makes more, you or a pokie machine?

The median income in Central Otago District is \$33,300. In comparison, every machine in Central Otago District made, on average, around \$39,565 last year.

That means a pokie machine makes around \$6,300 more each year than the average person in the district. **Who needs that money more?**
